CHAIR OF CHELMER CROUCH GROUP

Following the retirement of Canon Graham Blyth, the CCG clergy have asked Revd Lee Batson to act as Chair of the Group for the next three years. Lee will have responsibility for bringing the clergy together, and chairing meetings of the Council which meets three times a year and includes representatives from all the member Churches.

TRANSFORMING PRESENCE

As many of you will know, the Bishop of Chelmsford has launched a new strategy for the Diocese entitled Transforming Presence. It encourages us to think about how we live distinctively as Christians, how we might evangelise effectively, how we might be accountable to each other and what kind of ministry is required to lead the Church forward in mission. Individual Churches are also being encouraged to work ever more closely with each other and become less parochial in our outlook. The Chelmer Crouch Group has, of course, a long history of working collaboratively. It seemed right, therefore, to come together to consider our response to Transforming Presence so that we can discern what might be better done together and how we can support each other more effectively in our witness to the people of our communities. As a result, eight delegates from each CCG Church will be gathering at South Woodham Ferrers on Saturday, 6th October under the guidance of Canon Dr Graham Hamborg. The next edition of the Newsletter will contain a report on the day. In the meantime, please keep the event in your prayers, asking that God will truly show us how we can bring about the Gospel transformation across the Chelmer Crouch Group.

VISIT FROM THE BISHOP OF MARSABIT

On Sunday, 16th September, Boreham will be welcoming Bishop Rob Martin from the Diocese of Marsabit in Kenya. Rob's area is the same size as England and includes mainly nomadic peoples living in extremely harsh conditions. BRADWELL PILGRIMAGE 2012

It was a good day for the pilgrimage and remained sunny most of the time with no rain, which was good as the previous day had been grim. We were led by Bishop John but missed Bishop Stephen this year as it coincided with the National Synod. Bishop Christopher was also there and we were well led in our singing at the church, by the Salvation Army.

The theme for this year was Peace and Reconciliation and Henry Olonga our guest, and well know cricketer, did not disappoint, with his talk to us about his life and how he came to faith. The talk also reminded us that many Christians still suffer persecution for their faith, how lucky we are.

We were given an unexpected treat when Henry burst into song and what a beautiful voice he had. He sung to us twice during the day, the song I most enjoyed was 'Swing low sweet chariot.'

There were some interesting speakers to listen to during the afternoon. Nigel Watt, Volunteer Action for Peace, Fr. Rob Wickham, Rector of Hackney on 'The Churches Response to the London Riots in 2011,' and the one I personally went to 'Peace and Reconciliation in Israel-Palestine by Revd. Mones Farah, Vicar of Meadgate, Great Baddow.

As always it was an enjoyable and stimulating experience being a part of a great gathering of Christians. Do not under estimate the Bradwell Pilgrimage experience, over the recent years that I have been going I have found it a great way to involve people on the fringe of the church looking in, and seeing how they have developed from the experience. It should have the recommendation to 'bring a friend.'

Such a day can be very enjoyable and rewarding. You have time to clean up your bicycle and oil it, or to polish up your walking shoes/boots. Let's all try to do something towards the success of the event.
