DAPHNE TOVEY

As Christians we are encouraged to love each other. It was easy to love Daphne. A very kind, gracious and talented lady. Someone who, during her life, had time for us all.

We are now sad today as we say 'goodbye' to Daphne and offer our sympathy, support and love to Nick her husband, her daughter Fenella and Peter. Fenella's children, Jenny, Nicholas and Michael. Her son Peter and Heather, and their children Rebecca and James, together with her sisters, Cynthia and Angela, their husbands, and all members of her family.

We will miss her and our lives will not be the same.

We should celebrate. Daphne's journey has ended. Her pain has gone and we have wonderful memories to share. Helping us through our grief.

I can only talk about the time from when we met Daphne, Nick, Fenella and Peter when we came, as a family, to Sandon in 1971.

The first thing I remember was the old Rover car - the Tovey Car of Many Colours (said to be those of West Ham) that sped into the church car park, from which the family spilled out to take up their places in the Church choir or to ring the bells.

As our families got older our friendship grew.

Daphne and her family were involved in everything happening at St Andrew's and also great sailors with the Marconi Sailing Club. These days her children and grandchildren still play a major part in supporting the club and sailing.

Daphne was then the first Head Teacher at the newly built Beehive Lane Primary School.

Whilst Head, Daphne volunteered her support to paint the SAYF pantomime sets. I can remember the back-drops spread out all over the school hall floor drying out. Daphne used the water-type school paints. Never use them. Especially the Black - it would always show through years later. She painted wonderful, imaginative sets for 21 pantos. When she retired from school she carried on painting in barns at Sporhams and Mayfield Farms.

All through this period Daphne also worked with us on the annual SAYF youth festival. She did this for 25 years being a judge in the early years and then becoming an impeccable points' recorder. Nick and Daphne also presented the festival with the Tovey Music Award that the young musicians could compete for.

Daphne was a member of Sandon WI for a long time and helped them with their annual competitions. She also was a committee member of Sandon Over Sixties Club and worked with them for a very long time and was greatly loved by its members. Her artistic talents were used by us all. She did something for most organisations in the village, especially the church stationery.

For the 1990 passion play The Stained Glass Window, Daphne painted 2 pictures - she included all members of the cast and I still have the paintings in our attic.

She was the first woman to be Church Warden at St Andrew's Sandon. The first lay woman with permission of the Bishop to administer the Chalice at Holy Communion. Secretary to the PCC. On the Readers and Intercession lists to take part in services. She was part of the team that saw us through the interregnum between Father Hugh Bevan and Father Stephen Foster. (Continued Page 6)

But - she still found time to be with the family she was so proud of and loved. With Nick - always a willing partner. Together they supported and encouraged as many church and village activities as they could. They helped with the Crib Service each year, Nick in charge of lights, Daphne putting the Holy Family in the Crib. I will always see in my mind, Daphne in a Father Christmas bobble hat gently arranging the crib figures. Still more - over the last years Daphne, Barbara Underwood and their helpers have organised our church flowers for the different festivals, weddings, funerals and the stunning Easter Lily displays. Susan Gammon, Daphne and Barbara were the driving force behind many successful and profitable flower festivals - quite a team.

Daphne's other great love was her Saluki Dogs. She took Nick and the dogs all over the country. These beautiful dogs won many awards and their names were fantastic. We always watched Crufts to see if Daphne and the Dogs had made it. Birthday and Christmas cards from Daphne and Nick always included all the dogs' names. Ours just included Dillon.

Daphne was a member of the local Chelmsford and District Canine Club. Also she was a member of the National Saluki OR Gazelle Club.

You would think that she never had time spare to spend on her family but she did. They are now grown up, married with children. All show some of Daphne's talents and I know that her grandchildren loved and appreciated her very much. Each will remember their special "Granny" times.

We will each remember Daphne in our own way. I am sure many have wonderful memories.

Just one more from me. At a New Year's Eve party Nick brought the hand bells to chime in the new year. I will not forget the intense concentration on her face as Daphne waited to ring her bell. The tiniest one, rung in exactly the right place.

As families we have been at each other's special celebrations such as new year, birthdays, weddings etc. I suppose it can be said that we became classed as relatives to the Tovey family when Prince Charming (Peter Tovey) kissed Sleeping Beauty (Heather Ellis) and they REALLY GOT MARRIED.

Daphne has had wonderful support from her dear family and friends. She had sympathetic caring from Farleigh Hospice and others who cared for her and from Father Keith who ministered to her.

I know that if she could - Daphne would be writing you those wonderful thank you letters she would always send.

You are with God now Daphne. We love you and celebrate your life with us.

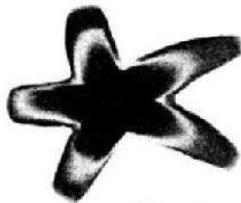

SANDON W.I. MEETING - APRIL 2010

The President, Eileen Bartrup, welcomed members, visitors and our Speaker Mr Brian Carline. She thanked Joan Mears for the flowers, and Jerusalem was then sung. Eileen then referred to the fact that two of our long standing members, Joan Davies and Daphne Tovey had recently died and been buried in Sandon Churchyard, and the Committee suggested that we should plant some Spring Bulbs in the memorial garden planted to celebrate our 90th birthday in memory of these two ladies.

The Speaker in March on English Cheeses had been very interesting and the Village Clean up had removed quite a lot of litter. The forms for the Bulb Scheme had arrived, there will be a new Speakers day on June 25th, and Maria is organising a trip to Denman for the Open Day on June 29th. The Mildmay group meeting is being convened by Sandon next Thursday and the Inter-Institute quiz will be on 14th May with the final (if we get that far) on July 2nd. Sadly we had received a letter from Walberswick WI saying that although we had corresponded with them for many years, they felt that there was little point in continuing as there seemed to be little hope of meeting again, and they thanked Pat Eden for her interesting letters.

The Speaker, Brian Carline then giving a very amusing talk about his 34 years as a Schoolmaster and was thanked by Dorothy Gray.. After tea, the report of the Count Annual meeting, written by Val Chiswell, but read in her absence by Margaret Gill was given. 1550 members attended the meeting held at the Brentwood centre, where they were welcomed by the Mayor of Brentwood and Julie Alen the County Chairman. The Treasurer said the accounts showed a profit, and George Mills and Dwyn Hendry spoke about George's continuing work for the children of Chernobyl, and he thanked the Federation for their support over the years. In the Chairman's report, Julie said how quickly the last four years had gone, and how healthy Essex is with 8 new WIs, and 2 more in the planning stage. She ended by urging members to be forward looking and to accept change, a message which was repeated by the new National Chairman Ruth Bond, making her first official visit to Essex. She said how the WI could exert its influence for good, and spoke of her visit to Malawi, and also to the Copenhagen climate change conference where due to a beurocratic mistake, she was refused entry! The results of the ACWW bag competition were announced, and Rose Jewett of Sandon WI was delighted that Julie Alen had bought her bag! The resolution for the AGM is on correct labelling of food and it was announced that June Ward is to be the new County Chairman. The afternoon Speaker was Ann Widdicombe who gave an amusing talk, but with a number of serious points. Anne Nickol then thanked the Institute for awarding her a Bursary to go to Denman College, and she had brought along some examples of the work she had done, and urged any member who had a chance to go to the College to take it as it is a lovely experience. The Flower of the Month was won by Marlene Bishop, and there were some lovely knitted and crocheted children's garments on display.

The next meeting will be on May 13th when the Resolution for the AGM will be discussed. A light lunch will be served at 12.45, but please let a Committee member know if you are coming.

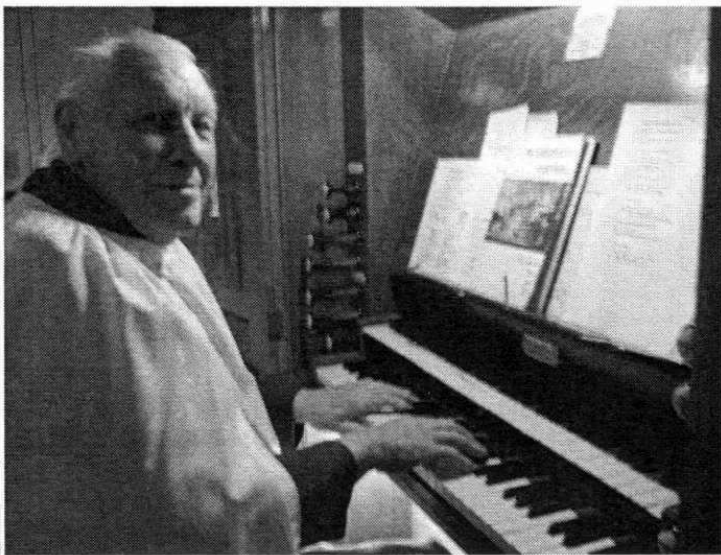

My Favourite Hymn - Ron Woods

Whilst I enjoy all hymns, I think my favourite must be that lovely evening hymn - *'The day thou gavest Lord is ended'*. It was also a favourite of my late wife, Betty - it was sung at her funeral. Whilst the words relate to the end of the day, it can also relate to the end of life and is increasingly used at funerals. Being one of the organists at the crematorium, I have sometimes played it three or four times in a day - and yet I do not tire of it.

The words were written by John Ellerton (1826-93) who, in 1885, served for four years as incumbent of the parish of White Roding. The music was written by Clement Scholefield (1839-1904), also ordained and Vicar of Holy Trinity, Knightsbridge, in the early 1900s. I have read that Queen Victoria chose this hymn to be sung at the 60th anniversary of her reign in 1897. It was also sung at the ceremony when Britain returned control of Hong Kong to China in 1997. This shows that it is still a favourite after all these years. One wonders whether the name of the tune 'St Clement' has some connection with the Christian name of the composer.

The hymn seems to speak about the world-wide church worshipping God and one is reminded of Christ's words: 'When two or three are gathered together in my name, I am in the midst of them.' The words are as relevant today as when they were written.
