#### FIRST READING

#### 2Corinthians 8.1-9

We want you to know, brothers and sisters,\* about the grace of God that has been granted to the churches of Macedonia; <sup>2</sup>for during a severe ordeal of affliction. their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. <sup>3</sup>For, as I can testify, they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means, <sup>4</sup>begging us earnestly for the privilege\* of sharing in this ministry to the saints – 5 and this, not merely as we expected; they gave themselves first to the Lord and, by the will of God, to us, <sup>6</sup>so that we might urge Titus

that, as he had already made a beginning, so he should also complete this generous undertaking\* among you.

Now as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you\*—so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking.\*

I do not say this as a command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others. For you know the

command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others. <sup>9</sup>For you know the generous act\* of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich.

## THE GOSPEL

#### Matthew 26. 6-13

When Jesus had finished saying all these things, he said to his disciples, <sup>2</sup>'You know that after two days the Passover is coming, and the Son of Man will be handed over to be crucified.'

3 Then the chief priests and the elders of the people

gathered in the palace of the high priest, who was called Caiaphas, <sup>4</sup>and they conspired to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him. <sup>5</sup>But they said, 'Not during the festival, or there may be a riot among the people.'

6 Now while Jesus was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper,\* <sup>7</sup>a woman came to him with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment, and she poured it on his head as he sat at the table. 8But when the disciples saw it, they were angry and said, 'Why this waste? 9For this ointment could have been sold for a large sum, and the money given to the poor.' 10But Jesus, aware of this, said to them, 'Why do you trouble the woman? She has performed a good service for me. 11For you always have the poor with you, but you will not always have me. <sup>12</sup>By pouring this ointment on my body she has prepared me for burial. <sup>13</sup>Truly I tell you, wherever this good news\* is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in remembrance of her.'
